


BOB GOFF AT HEARTLIGHT



For 36 years, Heartlight has been offering help and hope to parents caught in crisis situations where a temporary stay away from home to get help in resolving personal and family issues. There have now been over 3,400 kids that have passed through the doors of Heartlight, and over 500 staff that have sacrificed a year of their life to pour themselves into the lives of struggling teens.

As the country's premier residential counseling center for struggling teens, Heartlight offers a program second to none, an unparalleled facility on its 150-acre campus and a staff that is dedicated to the mission of offering help and hope to parents and teens in a broken world.

Heartlight is a relational ministry, in hopes of extending a hand of grace, motivated by love to reach the heart of teens and families, allowing restoration and resolve to challenges of the adolescent years.

Through having parents attend periodic retreats, along with intense counseling and group therapy sessions for the teens, the Heartlight counseling staff aims to resolve the heart issues driving teens' behavior. We hope to solve the presenting problems, not just treat the symptoms.

THE NEW KIDNEY

ON THE BLOCK



It was no surprise when my doctor told me that I needed to get on a transplant list to receive a new kidney. I knew it was coming. My mom had a transplant and the kidney disease (PKD) that I inherited from her, so there was no disbelief at the doctor's determination.

The process began of getting into a transplant program. My son decided to give up half his kidney collection and share one with me. Baylor Scott & White of Dallas admitted me to their program and the plan was to remove my two kidneys (20 pounds apiece! Yikes!), and then harvest Adam's and give it to me.

It was quite an ordeal with some complications from two major surgeries in two days, but once those hurdles were cleared, it's been a smooth, and sometimes a little bumpy, road to recovery while doing all we can to eliminate the "R" word of the world of transplants: "Rejection".

The transplant has truly limited my ability to travel which will begin back up in the summer. But, it has given me plenty of time to write, record, strategize and back off a bit from the crazy schedule of being gone 200 nights a year, accumulating almost 7,000,000 miles on American Airlines.













Most don't know that one-third of the kids we have at Heartlight have been adopted from about any place that has allowed international and domestic adoption. That means that over 1,350 adopted kids have lived at Heartlight, and it also means that we've learned quite a bit as to how to help those teens, while helping their parents in the challenges they have faced.

Chelsea Cameron (Kirk Cameron's wife) came to speak to all the adoption seminar participants, and we were given a "bonus-round" when Kirk, aka — the Dog Babysitter — came with Chelsea to be a "service human" to their dog. So, Kirk joined in. Together, with the Heartlight staff, and Kirk and Chelsea, the weekend event was a tremendous three-day effort. It was an opportunity to share

with families who have been struggling with their adopted teen some of the wisdom we've gathered through the years.

SOUTH STAFF HOUSE A PLACE OF REST



This project has been the longest in the history of Heartlight. We knew that the residential staff needed a place to rest, regain their sanity and build a loving community of support for one another. What started as a small project (so we thought), turned into a major series of projects — replacing the whole roof structure, building porches, and an eventual teardown of the interior of the house and a complete makeover, which includes tearing down all the floor substructure.

We should have torn it down and just started afresh, just like most remodels.

Well, the staff get to move in this summer (Finally!), and will have a place to take a break from the hard-work and challenging days of living with eight struggling teens. They deserve a break, and now, they're going to have one.

For the Fall of 2025 and Spring of 2026, Heartlight will host a few conferences, offering special weekends for parents seeking help, advice, a little bit of wisdom and an opportunity to develop some new parenting skills.

Over the years, we've found that not everyone needs to place a child at Heartlight just because they're struggling at home. That, coupled with the hundreds of calls we get every year, was a determining part of the development of retreats to meet the need of those that call. Many calls have come from parents with pre-teens, and many more from parents of post teens; those that are struggling to launch, need some "adulting" lessons and just haven't been prepared for the world that they've been thrust into.


We offer parents a lot of different options before considering placing their teen at Heartlight.

- Specialty Seminars (Adulting, Adoption, Preparing for Adolescence)


Then, if none of these resources are effective, the suggestion of the Heartlight Residential Program would become a part of the conversation.

In addition, we've introduced Courtney LaFleur to the radio programs and podcasts. Her expertise as a Licensed Professional Counselor coupled with her ability to "get to the heart of the issues" has been a wonderful transition of both programs, as well as bringing a bright and younger perspective on the issues that teens face.

The five-day release podcast provides an opportunity for all parents to benefit from the wisdom needed for today's parenting challenges. Interviews with teens, devotions by Mark, programs with Mark and Courtney, and opportunities for parents to have their questions answered all provide new parenting tools for moms and dads.


TUESDAY | REAL TEENS, REAL STORIES


All funds given at these games will be matched dollar for dollar up to \$100,000. If that's not a homerun, I don't know what is!






The three books that were announced last year were delayed because of Mark's health challenges with a new kidney. The plan is for these books to be released in early 2026.
